### Present Suffering Affirmed (4:12-16)

<sup>12</sup> Beloved, do not be surprised by the fiery ordeal occurring among you as a test, as if something strange were happening to you. 13 Instead, rejoice to the extent that you are participating in the Messiah's sufferings, so that, when his glory is revealed, you may be overcome with joy. 14 If you are reviled because of the name of the Messiah, you are actually blessed, because the Spirit of glory and of God rests on you. 15 None of you ought to suffer as a murderer or a thief or an evildoer or as one who rebels against the social order. 16 But if you should suffer as a "Christian" [Messiah-adherent], do not be
